

3 EASY STEPS TO BECOME A CERTIFIED ERGONOMICS PROCESS SPECIALIST



TRAINING:

Candidates must complete a minimum of 16 hours of training. The training consists of both classroom content and hands-on application. The training must be completed by an Ergo-ology employed ergonomist.



EXAM:

In order to develop a credible and valid examination, questions follow widely accepted standards and regulations such as the Uniform Guidelines on Employee Selection Procedures, EEOC, 1978. They may also be accredited by a third party to the standards, outlined under ISO/IEC 17-24:2012, which details the general requirements for personnel certification. Testing questions have been developed by professional ergonomists who have successfully completed the CEPS® program.



COMPLETED PROJECT:

Work products (projects) are required to demonstrate your proficiency to implement the information provided during training. A completion of at least one approved work product is required within 6 months of taking the CEPS® training and must pass inspection from a minimum of 3 Ergo-ology ergonomist.

These competencies have been identified as essential skills in the overall implementation of an ergonomics process in manufacturing and distribution facilities.
